Shaping the future in the fight against stalking

This is an exciting time to join the Board – helping to shape the future, leading the fight for stalking victims and making step-changes towards seamless support for them.

Action Against Stalking (AAS) is the UK-wide charity leading the way in advancing recognition of stalking as a crime, championing the rights of stalking victims globally, and supporting those who are or have been victims of stalking.

Having successfully led the campaign for legislative change, stalking is now recognized as a high profile, high impact and highly prevalent crime. The campaign has been a key driver for wider change and has set the blue print for legislation in England & Wales as well as in Europe.

AAS has recently refocused its strategic direction and we are seeking Trustees who have a passion for the charity's cause and who will work with us to achieve our priorities, including:

- Increase influence in promoting the need for tackling the crime of stalking, building community resilience, supporting prosecutions and aiming to reduce stalking crime.
- Improve victim support through establishment of a seamless pathway with partners in the delivery of its Specialised Multiagency Stalking Victim Support Service.
- Maximise income and financial sustainability so that the objectives of AAS can be achieved

Our requirements are for Specialist and Lay Trustees who bring relevant skills and experience to support the effective working of AAS. Trustees with specialist knowledge - conversant with the issue of stalking, with significant skills and/or experience in one or more of the following professional areas - criminal justice, law enforcement, legal (stalking specific), mental health, social work and/or victim support.

Lay Trustees - we are seeking significant skills and/or experience in one or more of the following areas: business development, communications/media, financial planning and management, raising income, management, organisational development and training.

The Trustee's role has a strategic and governance focus. However, until we have established our new substantive infrastructure, Trustees are needed to fill expertise-gaps to support the delivery of AAS priorities. The closing date for applications is 16th February 2018
