Why stalking is a serious issue?

Stalking is a serious criminal offence. Stalking is recognisable by its fixated, obsessive, unwanted and repeated behaviours. Victims suffer long-lasting emotional, psychological, financial and physical impacts. But many are unaware that specialist support services exist for victims of stalking.

Theme

The key focus of this year's national campaign is 'Join Forces Against Stalking'. The aim is to raise awareness of the importance of organisations working together to empower and support victims, enabling a seamless journey to create safer communities in Scotland.

When is National Stalking Awareness Week?

National Stalking Awareness Week runs from 22nd - 26th April 2024.

What is this toolkit for?

This toolkit should be used by organisations, institutions, individuals and services to show their support for National Stalking Awareness Week and victims of stalking – and to raise awareness of the crime of stalking, to promote the importance of a joined up approach to supporting victims of stalking in Scotland.

Key Messages

- Stalking is a serious criminal offence in Scotland. Stalking behaviours are Fixated, Obsessive, Unwanted and Repeated (FOUR)
- Services in Scotland are working together to ensure stalking victims have a seamless journey from reporting, to support and conviction of an offender or through the criminal justice journey and beyond.
- A multi-agency approach allows services to join together to empower and support victims of stalking by putting victims at the centre of service delivery.
- It is important that if you are being stalked, you speak out and get support. If you are in danger contact the police.
- Services are available for victims of stalking, offering psychological and practical support, to help them understand their experiences and empower them to speak out against stalking, with support from disclosure to conviction.
